Shifts

Two-hours shifts are: 11 am - 1 pm; 1 pm - 3 pm; 3 pm - 5 pm; 5 pm - 7 pm. Plus, clean-up crew only: 6:00 pm -8:00 pm. Please indicate all the times you are available. You will only be assigned to one shift unless you request more.

Job Descriptions (No experience necessary! On-the-job-training provided for all positions)
Recycling Monitors. Guide and educate attendees in reuse and recycling opportunities as well as proper disposal.

Resource Sorting. Guide and educate attendees in sorting waste materials into recycling, composting and trash bins.

Crowd Counters. Count attendees as they enter the fair. A counter is provided.

Information Table. Staff information table and direct attendees to specific exhibitor and events. Make announcements about upcoming events and fair "must sees."

Food Support. Help with preparation and clean up of cooking demonstrations. Re-supply food vendors with plates, cutlery, etc. (11-1 and 2-4 shifts only).

Exhibitor Relief. Cover exhibit booths for those who need a lunch or bathroom break.

Clean Up. Help exhibitors pack up and secure the site for the evening (6-8 pm only).
